Should you find that your child does have head lice, please contact your pharmacy or public health (687- 7049) for information/recommendations on treatments. You should also inform us at the school so that we may prevent further spread. Students may return to school after they have been treated provided they are free of live lice.

# WINTER WEATHER:

Occasionally weather conditions may cause cancellation or delay of school classes. Parents are asked to listen to the radio in the mornings for such announcements. Our school is in the Public Schools Branch and in the Morell Family of Schools. On days that there are delays students are to arrive according to the times indicated on the radio – teachers will not be available early to supervise students prior to these times. Please be sure that you have made arrangements for your child(ren) on such days or on days when we are forced to return home early due to weather conditions. If traveling arrangements for these days are going to be different for your child, please be sure that the homeroom teacher is aware of this.

## SAFE/LATE ARRIVAL:

Please email or call the school by 9:00 a.m., if your child is not attending school on a particular day. The district is tracking attendance and teachers must record attendance twice daily. The reason for absentees must also be recorded. When contacting the school, the main office phone number is 902-961-7340. Please ensure your child is in their classroom before 8:40 a.m. Instructions start at 8:40 a.m. and it is hard for teachers to make up instructional time.

# SCHOOL BUS TRANSPORTATION PERMITS:

In order for your child(ren) to be picked up or dropped off at a different location than their normal pick up or drop off location, a School Bus Transportation Permit must be completed by the administration at the school office and given to the bus driver. Therefore, you must send a bus note to the school with your child and include the following information: Your child's Name, Bus Number or Name of the driver of the bus that they will travel on, Pick Up Civic Address and/or Drop Off Civic Address. **Please Note: It is the policy of the Public Schools Branch to only allow bus changes for students for child care purposes only.**
