SCHOOL SUPPLIES - 2023-2024:

For the upcoming school year, the cost of school supplies for all grades at Morell Consolidated School will be covered by the PEI Government. Parents do not need to request supplies – they will be here ready for each student in September. Some grades will require headphones and a calculator which are not included. Parents will still need to supply their children with lunch bags, backpacks, indoor sneakers, and a water bottle.

For younger students, it is a good idea to label their belongings, and send a change of clothes with them in their backpacks. This helps them to feel more comfortable in the event of an accident, spill, or fall.

SCHOOL PLAYGROUND:

past year, the Morell & Area Early Learning Center and the Morell Consolidated School have been the target of vandalism and theft. We certainly feel the school and playground are part of the community and have no issue when community members use the facilities after hours. We love to see young people being physically active and enjoying our equipment. However, we are disheartened when outdoor toys are broken, equipment is stolen, and users leave their cans, broken bottles, garbage and dog waste behind!

This breaks our hearts (and our bank accounts). Most recently, the daycare was vandalized for a third time so they were forced to purchase their own security cameras. The school's set of hockey nets recently disappeared forcing us to buy two more nets this year at a cost of near \$500.

We are encouraging MCS family and community members **to use, but not abuse**, our playgrounds. We have video surveillance covering some areas of the grounds but we would love to inform the community of the importance of working together to protect our school grounds. As a school, we try to educate our students in making good choices and we are hoping parents could share the same message with their children and the school community.
